Project Vision

A place for young adults to find healing, to learn and - in time - to grow into leaders who raise up leaders.

Mission

To provide immediate shelter, holistic support, academic bridge programs, and emotional, spiritual, and technical empowerment that will enable five young adults to continue in education and build self-reliant futures.

Focus Group

Vulnerable post-high-school girls aged 16-22 who lack stable shelter, housing security, or safe pathways to pursue higher education.

The group includes survivors of exploitation, those experiencing homelessness, unaccompanied youth, and those aging out of care.



Summary

House of Hadassah* - the first planned rescue initiative of the Camp David programme - will foster a culture of mutual mentorship, resilience, and leadership. From this home, house parents will provide emotional, spiritual and academic support to the participants as they transition into further education.

** Meaning: myrtle. The myrtle tree in the Bible is a symbol of beauty, blessings, restoration, and God's faithfulness. It represents the flourishing and abundance God desires for His people.*

Project Pillars

1. Safe shelter
2. Basic needs stabilisation (meals, clothing, healthcare access, and security).
3. Spirituality, purpose, and values.
4. Education Access Bridge
5. Technical and Career Pathways

Objectives

1. Provide a safe and supportive environment for the girls.
2. Equip them with essential computer skills.
3. Offer spiritual mentorship through Bible study sessions.
4. Build their confidence and self-reliance through technical skills training.
5. Sponsor and support their transition into college or university education.

Programme

Following the release of the national examination results, there is typically an eight-month transition period before students enrol in university or college. During this period, the five girls residing in the Rescue House will participate in a structured program designed to empower them intellectually, technically, and spiritually.

Learning Schedule

- **Computer Studies.** A four-month computer training course will equip the girls with essential digital skills.
- **Bible Study Program.** A two-month discipleship and mentorship program will focus on: spiritual growth, personal development, character building, guided group sessions.
- **Technical Skills Training** - A two-month skills development program in a selected technical area such as: peer counselling, life skills training, mental health awareness, career guidance sessions for high school students, talent development workshops/music, any other skill depending on availability and interest.
- **College/University Education** - upon completion of the 8-month program the girls will be sponsored to pursue their preferred courses in accredited colleges or, if funds and academic results allow, universities.
